March 1940, Peter was born in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn but his family moved to Washington DC in February, 1942 where his father, a future VP of Western Union, opened a facility to provide the communication links

needed for the war effort. His childhood was typical of Irish Catholic families at the time; 4 brothers, Jesuit education, alter boy, cub scout, paper delivery, household chores, etc. After high school graduation in 1958, he enlisted in the Air Force and spent the 1<sup>st</sup> year in Electronics School prior to a four year deployment in England. Where he was destined to meet and marry Jimany Sue Pringle, the love of his life.

July 1945, Jimany was born in Weatherby, Yorkshire. Her father, Sir Norman Hamilton Pringle, 9<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Stichill, was a squadron leader at the nearby Royal Air Force base. At war's end, the family moved back to the London area. She was educated at Convent schools in Kent. After leaving school she worked at Kodak. She was Miss Kodak one year. Jimany lived in the village of Kings Langley which was near Bovingdon, a RAF/USAF base. Peter was at Bovingdon installing a microwave communications station. Destiny did its thing, they met and were married in August 1964.


Peter became a Technical Representative and they moved to Metz, France where he worked at the NATO Air Traffic Control Center. After a year, Jimany somehow became pregnant, and they decided to return to the US for their life with a baby son. In the states, Jimany worked at American University as Business Manager of the bookstore. Peter started his thirty-three year career with the US Government which culminated with a Presidential Appointment as the Special Policy Advisor to the Director General of the United Nations International Atomic Energy Agency in Wien Austria. They repatriated at the end of the appointment and retired in 1995. They have 2 sons, 2 lovely daughters-in-law, 6 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

## Director Notes:

The Holidays are near, and a new year will be here before we know it. I'd like to talk about when residents get down to the last month of the year and then suddenly realize they have more meals left on their account than they can possibly use. The maximum number of takeout meals allowed per household, per evening will be six meals. We hope that everyone understands the rationale behind this policy as we try to offer the highest quality food and service.

In October, the Arbor Pointe Management Board met and discussed the fees for the 2022 operating budget. APM will be increasing the base fee by \$50.00 this year from \$1,200 to \$1,250. Also, going forward in 2022 the meal fee will increase from \$18.00 to \$20.00 per meal.

I mention this subject every year because it is helpful to those who are unfamiliar with the Florida "Do Not Resuscitate Order". It's always scary to think of an emergency affecting you or someone you love, but the fact of the matter is that as we get older, the risk of having a life-altering emergency increase. For this reason, some people choose to sign a Do Not Resuscitate Order (DNRO) if they may face a life-or-death incident.

When emergency personnel is called to a home due to a health emergency, the main rule of thumb is that they will do whatever possible to keep the patient alive. Oftentimes, this means using invasive emergency techniques such as breathing tubes or heart shocks. When someone is in poor health, one of these types of incidents can leave the patient in a worse condition with an extremely poor quality of life, and potentially only living off tubes and machines. Therefore, some people choose to sign a Do Not Resuscitate Order, which alert emergency personnel to the fact that this person does not want to be resuscitated if their breathing or heart stops.

In the State of Florida, only those with end-stage medical conditions can secure a DNRO. The DNRO form is form number 1896, and it can be found in many doctors' offices or on the Florida Department of Health website. It is a yellow form that must be completed by either the patient or a legal representative of the patient, and the patient's physician. It's important to note that the form must always be on the required yellow paper and is not valid on white or any other color paper. The DNRO should be kept in an easily accessible location in the home; a preferred location would be on your refrigerator with your file for life. Remember it holds instructions for emergency responders who come to the aid of a patient and tells first responders that the patient does not want to be resuscitated with artificial breathing tubes or undergo CPR or heart shocks.

In closing, our annual "Employee Appreciation Awards Ceremony" will be held on Friday, December 10<sup>th</sup> in the Colonnade dining room at 2:30 pm.


### Out with the Old

**Reminder: End of the Year Meal Planning**

With the end of the year quickly approaching, please remember to check your meal statements. Any remaining meals January 1, 2022 will be forfeited (unless you are a first year resident). Please note the following rules when planning your dining experiences:

- You may pick up or have delivered up to 6 meals per residence. (No more than one (1) raw meat per resident)
- Special events and holidays with one seating have a maximum two (2) guest cap. Double seating events have a maximum of eight (8) guests per residence.

Reservations for all December Holiday begins Wednesday, December 1st; Keep an eye out for the **Holiday Reservation Form** that will be used for all holiday reservations. Please turn these into the Hostess Desk in the Colonnade.

As a reminder, The dining room is open Monday thru Saturday for dinner, Sunday's for brunch and Thursday's for lunch. All meals are available for pickup or delivery when the Colonnade is open.

Another great way to utilize surplus meals is picking up lunch, Monday thru Saturday. This can be done over the phone by calling the kitchen (239-591-4851) before 10:30am or dropping off a request the night before. Lunch can be picked up at noon.
