
In the Garden:

C.A.M.'s Corner:

Lobby renovations at the Tower are continuing, we are currently on schedule and look forward to a beautiful new space when the construction is completed. Remember to check for notifications on closings and openings of the Gathering Place and relocations. Please continue to be patient and work within the construction limitations.

In other news, Dryer Vent cleaning will occur this month. This service will assist in removing any build up and avoid lint fires. We are also looking forward to having our windows washed. Please look for memos on exact dates that these services will occur. Along with fire, the greatest threat to your unit (as well as your neighbors') comes from water damage. Water damage is the most common issue relating to insurance claims for condominium residences. Because of the risk to you and your neighbors around and below you, it is imperative to be familiar with the water shutoff valves associated with your specific unit. All your water supplied entities in your home (kitchen, laundry, bathrooms) have their own water shutoff valves. Unfortunately, sometimes the source of a water leak cannot be identified or shut off at the specific location, and a complete shutoff is necessary. Knowing where your main water shutoff is located to turn off the water as quickly as possible- or identify the location to someone who is capable- ensures the most protection to minimize water damage. Maintenance is on-call 24 hours a day, but not on-site 24 hours a day. When a water emergency is occurring, you will not want to have to wait until maintenance arrives to get the flooding to stop, and neither will your neighbors below you. or the neighbors below them! Please contact maintenance if you need help finding your main shut off valve. There are proven systems, of which I recommend, that can be installed in your unit to monitor for leaks at every fixture and automatically shut off the water to your unit. If you are interested in such, please contact me directly to discuss options. Many of these systems have been installed in Tower Pointe and have saved potential water disasters by alerting the presence of a leak and shutting off the water immediately.
