





**Frank Stanton Tower 1401**

Frank Stanton was born and reared in Philadelphia. His father served in the US Army Air Corps and was gassed in Belgium. He survived but was left handicapped with pulmonary problems. Frank's high IQ allowed him to win scholarships to La Salle Prep School and La Salle College where he also excelled in rowing. Under Jack Kelly (Grace Kelly's father) he rowed in crews that won the US and Canadian

schoolboy championship; numerous rowing championships for Vesper boat club, and stroked La Salle College's first Dad Vail national championship eight-oared shell.

He also won a U.S. Navy Scholarship but lost it when the Navy found he was colorblind. When they learned he had been accepted at the University of Penn, the Navy offered him a commission in the Supply Corps if he got the Penn degree in one year. He did. His first assignment was on an aircraft carrier in the North Atlantic and the Mediterranean.

After the Navy, Frank entered the advertising business with Benton and Bowles research department where he invented many systems for measuring advertising effectiveness. During the next ten years, he and his wife, Barbara, were busy on the parenting front, giving birth to five children, all boys. Barbara often said, "If it had been five girls, I'd never had made it." Barbara passed away in Arbor Glen two years ago. They were married 66 years.

Friend Dr. Allan Weiss graduated from La Salle University. He encouraged Frank to underwrite an NCH clinic which would deal with people who suffer mood problems and addiction. After Dr. Weiss's departure from NCH, negotiations on the grant lagged. Frank then shifted his attention to La Salle which has just announced a Paul Stanton Wellness Center in honor of one of Frank's sons. This generous man needs our activities to open and we hope they will appear soon.

Later she joined Professional Speakers Unlimited, giving her hat talk in 16 states! ## Director's Notes:

As I write this, I am very happy to report that to the best of my knowledge all residents in this community are COVID free. You are all doing a wonderful job keeping yourselves and your neighbors safe. Please keep up the good work and continue doing what you are doing because it is definitely working.

For those of you who have a long-term care insurance policy; I'll bet you have had it for a long time. And those who don't have a policy might ask what is a long-term care insurance policy. It's an insurance policy designed to cover at least some if not all of your expenses if you have a chronic but not life-threatening illness, long-term disability, or you are unable to live independently because you can't perform a number of ADL'S (activities of daily living). Those activities typically include ambulation, bathing, dressing, eating, grooming, toileting, and being able to move from a sitting to a standing position. Most policies also cover cognitive impairments, such as Alzheimer's disease.

Under the terms of most long-term care policies, you can be cared for in an Assisted Living Facility or at home. The insurance pays for custodial care, which must be provided by licensed professionals. Arbor Glen is an "Assisted Living Facility" with 24/7 nursing care which meets the qualifications for most long-term care policies.

Every policy is different, so if you have a long-term health care policy you would want to read through it to see what it will provide for you if and when ever needed. If you have any questions about your policy, I urge you to call your insurance company for clarification. These plans provide a specific daily or monthly benefit for a predetermined benefit period. Most policies have an elimination period, which lasts from the day you become eligible until the day the insurer begins to pay usually; 30, 60 or 90 days. I have seen some older policy's that were effective immediately. When a plan is purchased you generally have a choice of the benefit, benefit period, and elimination period that makes the most sense to you and that you can afford.

In closing I want to include some Tower Pointe friendly reminders; first Swimmers must be wearing a cover-up when entering or exiting the Lobby, also no dripping suits are permitted. Secondly our canine friends must use the side entrances and must be carried if going beyond the elevators to the Lobby. They are not to use the front lobby door, even if they are leashed. Thank you for your cooperation.




## Monday Night at the Movies Returns!
